Vomiting after intake of food for three week duration.

History:

Puppy had vomiting of food and white foam after ingestion of ¼ - ½ cup of food for three week duration. No problem associated with water intake. The puppy tested positive for hookworms and coccidiosis. There was no improvement after treatment of fecal parasites. The puppy was lethargic and weak. Mucous membranes were pale and tacky.


